



The Way ...Is a Person - Part 1 Discussion Guide

Jesus called Himself “The Way.” He also claimed, “No one comes to the Father except through Me.” Christianity has clung to this truth for centuries, but what does it mean? In this series, we take a deeper look at who Jesus is, what He represented, and how He changes our lives today! This week, we focus on who Jesus both claimed and proved Himself to be.

Jump Start

Leader: This section is designed to get discussions started, examine God's truth, and apply it to our week.

1. When you think of Jesus, what are your first thoughts/instincts?
2. **Read [John 14:1-11](#)**. Where is Jesus going? What do we know about Jesus' identity in these verses? In what ways have you seen Jesus be the “truth” or the “life” in your life?
3. **Read [John 20:30-31 and Hebrews 13:8](#)**. When you think of Jesus' miracles, which one(s) stand out to you and why? How are we affected by the miracles Jesus performed? Have you ever experienced a miracle in your life?
4. **Read [2 Corinthians 1:20, Hebrews 11:8-12, and Hebrews 6:13](#)**. What actions did it take from Abraham for God to make a promise to him? Have you ever received a promise from God? How did you know it was from God? How can we begin to better listen and apply God's promises in our lives?

5. Final Thought: **Read [John 8:12](#)**. What does Jesus mean when He calls Himself the Light of the world? What are the advantages of walking in God's light? What are the fears? How has walking in the light impacted your life?

Deeper

Leader: This section is designed for further use in your Life Group or for personal study. These can also be used as discussion points and ways to stay connected with your group throughout the week.

This week, we have focused on Jesus' identity as a Miracle Worker. How do miracles work? What is their purpose? When does God choose to do them and when does He refrain? In this week's "Deeper" study, we'll take a closer look at miracles and the details surrounding them in the Bible.

6. **Read [Deuteronomy 13:1-4 and Exodus 7:10-13](#)**. Why would God allow others (nonbelievers) to perform signs and wonders? How did Jesus differentiate Himself from the sorcerers of Pharaoh or the people described in Deuteronomy? Have you ever been tricked by something you thought was of God, but then discovered was not?

7. **Read [John 11:35-44](#)**. Why did the people believe Jesus could have healed Lazarus' sickness, but didn't even think of a resurrection? What was the purpose of this miracle and Jesus' prayer? Why can't we perform miracles in the same way Jesus did?

8. **Read [Matthew 26:29-46](#)**. How is Jesus' prayer in the Garden different from all His other prayers? How did anyone learn what Jesus said in His private prayer to record it in the Bible? Why didn't God answer Jesus' prayer with protection from the cross? How does this apply to you and the miracles you are desiring in your life?
