



The Way ...To Be Healed - Part 3 Discussion Guide

Jesus called Himself “The Way.” He also claimed, “No one comes to the Father except through Me.” Today we take a deeper look at God’s promise to heal and the fact that Jesus brought that about on the cross. We’ll look at what complete healing actually means.

Jump Start

Leader: This section is designed to get discussions started, examine God’s truth, and apply it to our week.

1. What is your worst or silliest injury?
2. **Read [Luke 7:11-17](#)**. Why did Jesus choose to perform a miracle for this woman and her son?
3. At this time, John the Baptist was in prison. **Read [Luke 7:18-20](#)**. Why was John the Baptist so important in Jesus’ ministry? Why do you think he doubted? Have you ever questioned why some people have experienced miracles, while you (or someone you love) have not?
4. **Read [Luke 7:21-23](#)**. Why would people be offended by healings and miracles? Why might John in particular have been offended? When have you been offended by God, and how have you dealt with it?
5. **Read [Psalm 103:2-3](#), [Hebrews 11:13](#), and [Luke 5:23](#)**. Have you ever prayed for physical healing, but did not receive it? What is the connection between having your sins forgiven and being healed? What is God’s ultimate desire for His children?
6. Final Thought: **Read [Isaiah 53:4-5](#), [Matthew 8:16-17](#), and [1 Peter 2:24](#)**. What is the connection between the prophecy found in Isaiah and the scriptures in Matthew and 1 Peter? Did your spiritual healing have a price? Why do we sometimes feel we are owed more than what God has already given?

Deeper

Leader: This section is designed for further use in your Life Group or for personal study. These can also be used as discussion points and ways to stay connected with your group throughout the week.

7. **Read [Mark 5:22-43](#), [Mark 9:21-29](#), [Mark 11:24](#).** What are some of the similarities and differences we see among these three healings? How do they tie into the Mark 11 verse? What is the connection between faith and healing? When you have prayed for healing or a miracle, what is your approach?

8. **Read [John 9:1-11](#).** Why does God allow us to face struggles and sufferings? What struggles have you faced and seen God use?

9. **Read [Acts 3:1-19](#).** Why do Peter and John consistently point to Jesus during the healing? How did Peter and John use the healing to further the Gospel? How can you use the experiences you have had and seen to further the Gospel?
