Introspect

Investigate

“But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.”

Read 1 John 1:5-7

- What makes stepping into the light possible?
- Now that we've talked about stepping into the light, what does it mean to *walk* in the light?
- How does living in community with one another help us walk in the light?

Read John 8:12 and 8:31-32

- What message is Jesus trying to communicate to the Pharisees?
- How does being honest about our issues ultimately bring healing into our relationships?

Incorporate

- Think about how your relationship with God affects your relationships with other people. Would you say you are authentic in your relationship with God? Why or why not?
- How do you receive and respond to authenticity? In what ways might it make you uncomfortable?
- What fears do you have that might be keeping you from being open and honest with your Life Group about issues you are facing in your life? How can you overcome those fears?
- What's your next step towards authenticity? How has being real brought healing and growth into your life?
